

About the Program

Metropolitan offers free inperson water use surveys for large commercial landscapes to provide property owners with recommendations for reducing water waste. Surveys are scheduled on a first-come, first-served basis. Apply as soon as possible since funding is limited.

Eligibility

Eligible landscapes include industrial and commercial sites, homeowner association common areas, and institutional places like schools, parks, and government facilities. A property must have at least one acre of irrigated landscape to receive a survey and fall within the Metropolitan's service area. These requirements will be verified by a pre-inspection of the property.

What to **Expect**

The certified landscape auditor will conduct a comprehensive review of the irrigation system including:

- System pressure
- Controllers
- Site conditions and irrigation scheduling
- Issues that cause higher water use, such as valve malfunctions, high or low pressure, sprinkler misalignment, poor draining, breaks and leaks, and runoff
